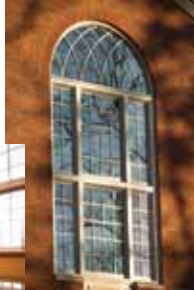

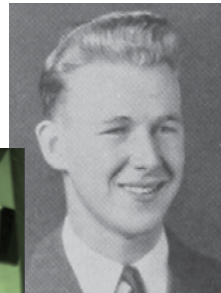
*One's purpose can be measured by many, but is defined by only one.*
